




## Description: Databases Health Behavior in School Aged Children

- ‘Health Behaviour in School-Aged Children: WHO Collaborating Cross-National Study (HBSC)’
- HBSC began in 1982 as a scientific collaboration between researchers in 3 European countries
- Now > 40 participating countries and national teams from Europe and North America
- Study cycle 4 years
- Sample: min. 4.500 adolescents (11 to 15 years old) in each country

## Description: Databases Health Behavior in School Aged Children

### Aims of HBSC study

- To collect cross-nationally comparable data on health related behaviours
- To monitor health and health related behaviours as well as social determinants of health in adolescence
- To understand social and environmental factors that influence health behaviours & health and well-being



## Description: Databases Health Behavior in School Aged Children

### Family affluence as social indicator


- Set of questions on the material conditions
  - “Does your family own a car?”; “Do you have your own bedroom for yourself?”; “How many times did you travel away on holiday with your family?” (past 12 months); “How many computers does your family own?”
- Calculation of a composite score
- Classification: low, medium, high family affluence

## Description: Databases Health Behavior in School Aged Children


**Indicators** (standard international core questionnaire + optional packages)

- Positive health including self-reported health, life satisfaction, mental well-being, body image, etc
- Risk behaviours including tobacco, alcohol and drug use, sexual behaviour, violence
- Health behaviours including eating habits, physical activity, etc

## HBSC Results: 13 yr olds who rate their health as poor or fair




## HBSC Results: 15 yr olds who drink at least weekly





## Family affluence in different countries



## Description: Databases KiGGS

The German Health Interview and Examination Survey for Children and Adolescents

- Conducted 2003-2006 as a nationwide, representative interview and examination survey for the age group 0-17 years
- N=17,641 participants from 167 communities
- Response rate: 66.6%
- Modular structure: Core survey + 5 modules (environmental exposure, nutrition, mental health, motor fitness; representative sample in Schleswig-Holstein)

## Description: Databases KiGGS

The German Health Interview and Examination Survey for Children and Adolescents (KiGGS)

- objective measures of physical and mental health
- parent- or self-reported questionnaires (age 14-17) on:
  - subjective health status
  - health behaviour
  - health care utilisation
  - social and migrant status
  - living conditions,
  - environmental determinants of health


## Description: Databases KiGGS

KiGGS shows strong associations between social indicators (parental education, income, parents' job position, attended school)

and


indicators of health and health behavior

# Obesity in childhood and adolescence by SES (parents)




# Smoking: adolescent's and parental education

(daily or occasional smoking)




# Intergenerational educational mobility

# Intervention: Database NRW

## Some examples

- “Gesund aufwachsen in Münster”: several health promoting activities including midwife’s consultation hours in kindergardens
- “Fitkids”: support for children with parents addicted to drugs (“empowerment”)
- Frauengesundheitstreff Bremen-Tenever: venue for migrant women living in an urban district with high rates of unemployment

## Frauengesundheitstreff Bremen-Tenever

- Located in a shopping center („Café“)
- offering
  - open meetings
  - courses (following the women's requests; e.g. German for beginners, alphabetisation, riding bicycles)
  - counseling (including baby care, healthy nutrition)



## Conclusions

- Health of children and adolescents is an important topic
- No clear understanding of the mechanisms producing health inequalities
- Empirical data draw attention to the social determinants of health in youth


